The cost of an away rotation depends on many variables. Traveling to the rotation, short-term housing costs, and application/tuition costs are the expenses students mentioned most frequently.


STUDENT OUT-OF-POCKET AWAY ROTATION EXPENSES





A total of 16,530 unique electives (and to better match students' schedules, many more alternative date options for each of these specialty rotations) were available through the VSLO program in the 2024-25 academic year.
