As our curriculum emphasizes exceptional patient care within a setting that prioritizes community and student support, the personal attributes that applicants demonstrate are key as we consider who will thrive in and enhance our community. We evaluate these in the written application by way of the quality and consistency of essays, experiences, and letters of recommendation. During the interview phase we conduct one-on-one conversational interviews and incorporate our students and faculty throughout our interview day to introduce future students to our community.</p>

We ultimately hope our graduates will choose to practice in and care for WA communities.</li> <li>• Experiences with rural and/or underserved communities: one of the key experiences we are looking for are those who come from or have experience with these communities.</li> </ul> <p>Student Affairs:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Financial education: Between 40-50% of our student body comes from low socioeconomically backgrounds. It is important that we have resources to support them. On our Student Affairs team, we have a Director for Financial Education who meets with students each year to build a plan for debt management.
